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DIET AND FASTING	<p>You will need to purchase a Bowel Prep Kit (\$10-\$15). You can purchase this from Dr Gastroenterology, Dr Scope or your Pharmacy. Do not take oral medications 1 hour either side of your preparation.</p> <p>3 days before your procedure: You will need to restrict your diet avoiding high fibrous foods.</p> <p>AVOID: Multigrain bread, seeds, poppy seeds.</p> <p>Example of what you may eat:</p> <table border="1"> <tr> <td>Eggs – Poached/boiled</td> <td>Cottage Cheese</td> <td>Fish – White Steamed</td> <td>Low fat yoghurt</td> </tr> <tr> <td>Skim Milk</td> <td>White Bread /Pita</td> <td>White rice</td> <td>Light coloured jelly</td> </tr> <tr> <td>Pumpkin – well cooked</td> <td>Potato – well cooked</td> <td>Chicken Breast Meat</td> <td></td> </tr> </table> <p>The day before your procedure you must NOT eat solid food. 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What is a Gastroscopy /Colonoscopy?

A gastroscopy & colonoscopy is an examination of the small and large bowel. To do this, they will use a long, thin flexible tube containing a camera (different sizes for each) and a light to view the lining of your organs in order to suggest the best course of treatment for you. You will be given a sedative so that you are not awake for the procedure. During the examination biopsies (small samples) of tissue may be taken. If necessary, some conditions may be treated through the endoscope. If you have a serious disease of your heart, lungs etc. or have diabetes requiring Insulin or tablet treatment, please contact our office 03 9044 4200 to discuss a special examination
